

**WELCOME NEWCOMERS!**

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

**MOST HOLY NAME OF MARY**

The Turks invaded the German Empire in 1683, while Mohammed IV ruled in Constantinople. A mighty Moslem army marched through Hungary and Austria, until it came in sight of Vienna. To their disgrace, it must be said that Christians had provoked the infidels to this attack. Yielding to the entreaties of his generals, Leopold I left Vienna together with the Empress. The Turkish army of 150,000 men, reinforced by 40,000 Hungarians who were in rebellion against the Emperor, laid siege to the capital from July 14<sup>th</sup> to September 12<sup>th</sup>.

Pope Innocent IX and John Sobieski, King of Poland, had entered into a league to support the Emperor against the common enemy. Therefore, as soon as Sobieski heard of the siege, he at once made ready to march to the relief of the besieged. On September 11<sup>th</sup> the Christian army took up its position on the mountains near Vienna.

On the next day Sobieski, placing himself under the patronage of the Blessed Virgin Mary, attacked the enemy and the Turks were completely routed. Vienna and Christendom were saved. In commemoration of this victory, Innocent XI instituted the feast of the Holy Name of Mary, that on it the faithful may recommend to God, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin, the necessities of the Church and return Him thanks for His protection. 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**EJACULATIONS AND INVOCATION TO THE MOST HOLY NAME OF MARY**  
**Raccolta #292**

The faithful who devoutly invoke the most holy name of Mary may gain:

*An indulgence of 300 days;  
A plenary indulgence once a month on the usual conditions for the daily devout repetition of the invocation;*

*A plenary indulgence at the hour of death if they have been wont to recite the aforesaid invocation frequently during life, and have gone to confession and received Holy Communion, or at least have made an act of contrition, invoking the holy Name of Jesus vocally if possible, otherwise in their hearts, and accepting death with resignation from God's hand, as the just punishment of their sins.*

Vouchsafe that I may praise thee, O sacred Virgin; Give me strength against thine enemies. *An indulgence of 300 days. A plenary indulgence on the usually conditions, if this invocation is repeated daily for a month.*
