

WELCOME NEWCOMERS!

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

Raise us up, we beseech Thee, O Lord by the apostolic assistance of blessed Peter, Thine Apostle: so that the weaker we are, the more mightily we may be helped by the power of his intercession: and that being perpetually defended by the same holy Apostle, we may neither yield to any iniquity, nor be overcome by any adversity. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. *An indulgence of 500 days. A plenary indulgence once a month, on the usual conditions, for the daily recitation of these prayers.*

LENT

For many, the very thought of the approach of Lent is enough to cause dread. Our human nature shrinks from the idea of self-denial. But for the soul, this season is one that is most beneficial for those who spend it well. Our Divine Lord said: “Unless you do penance, you shall perish.” As much as the thought of sacrifice may frighten us, we must reflect on the tremendous value of penance for the soul. Let us examine some of its many benefits.

First, penance serves to atone for the temporal punishment due to our sins. It shortens the time we would otherwise have to spend in purgatory. Second, penance curbs our unruly appetites. It helps us to gain control over our disordered inclinations. Penance strengthens our willpower, helping us to fulfill our resolutions and resist the temptations of the wicked one. Prayer is powerful, but when united to penance, it becomes even more valuable. Our Lord said that some devils are driven out only by prayer and fasting.

Another advantage of penance is that it elevates our minds to the contemplation of heavenly things. Penance makes us more attune to the voice of God and His grace. Penance is also a proof of our love for Jesus Christ. He died for us—are we unwilling to perform even small acts of self-denial for love of Him? In short, penance opens the gates of heaven to us and to those for whom we pray. All the saints practiced penance; let us follow their example.

But penance alone will not ensure a good Lent. It must be accompanied by a reflection on Our Lord’s passion, if it will produce its beneficial effects. How could we ever adequately appreciate all that Jesus suffered for us? We can at least try to understand better His love, by meditating on what He suffered in the terrible passion. *Excerpts from a 2/10/13 letter from Fr. Benedict to parishioners.*

BLESSED ASHES will be distributed after each Mass today for those who were unable to receive them on Wednesday.

EMBER DAYS: The Ember Days for the spring season occur this week on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. For those bound to the Lenten fast, there is no additional penitential requirement. All others are bound to the partial abstinence on Wednesday and Saturday. On those days meat is permitted only once.

LENTEN FASTING: The Church law on Fasting requires all adults, aged 21-59 to fast every day of Lent except Sundays, unless excused from this law for health reasons. Fasting means that only one full meal is allowed, which may contain mean, unless it

is a day of total abstinence. There is no eating between meals. Two small meatless meals may be taken which, if combined, would not equal or exceed the amount of food taken at a normal main meal.

DOCTRINE CLASS: There will be a doctrine class this Thursday, February 22, at 7:00 pm at the seminary. The class will also be live-streamed.

SEMINARY RETREAT: Our annual Seminary Lenten Retreat will take place next weekend.

LENTEN DEVOTIONS: The Stations of the Cross are recited every Friday of Lent at 11:00 am (10:20 am on First Friday). Also, Sunday Vespers will be chanted in the seminary chapel every Sunday of Lent at 4:30
