

WELCOME NEWCOMERS!

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- **Women and girls** must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
 - **Men and boys** should wear a suit coat and tie
 - Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
 - Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

Saint Matthias, Apostle – February 24

From the *Acts of the Apostles* we learn that St. Matthias had been one of the companions of Our Savior from the day of His baptism by St. John; for when there was question of electing an apostle to take the place of the apostate Judas, St. Peter spoke: “Of these men who have been in our company all the time that the Lord Jesus moved among us, from John’s baptism until the day that He was taken up from us, of these one must become a witness with us of His Resurrection” (Acts 1:21). Two were proposed: Barsabbas and Matthias, and the latter was chosen by lot. About one hundred and twenty persons were present at this election. According to an ancient tradition handed down by St. Clement of Alexandria and confirmed by Eusebius and St. Jerome, St. Matthias was one of the seventy-two disciples of Our Lord. It was after this occurrence that the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, among whom St. Matthias was then numbered.

St. Clement of Alexandria writes that St. Matthias was remarkable for inculcating the necessity of mortifying the flesh with its irregular passions and desires. According to the Greeks, St. Matthias suffered martyrdom in Colchis, a district of Asia Minor, situated on the shores of the Black Sea, south of the Caucasus Mountains. Here it was that St. Matthias probably ended his life a glorious martyrdom.

PRAYER: O God, who joined Blessed Matthias to the company of Thy Apostles, grant, we beseech Thee, that through his intercession, we may always experience Thy tender mercy toward us. Amen.

**Saint Gabriel of Our Lady of Sorrows
Confessor – February 27**

St. Gabriel was born at Assisi in 1838. He was guided by Our Lady into the Passionist Institute and became a veritable Apostle of her Sorrows. At twenty-four years of age he died of tuberculosis, having already attained to a heroic degree of sanctity by a life of self-denial and great devotion to Our Lord’s Passion. He was canonized by Pope Benedict XV in 1920. He is the patron of youth, and especially of young religious...after his death (in 1862) many miracles occurred at his tomb in Isola di Gran Sasso, Italy. By a decree of April 13, 1932, Pope Pius XI extended this feast and Mass to the whole Church.

PRAYER: O God, who taught Blessed Gabriel to dwell continually upon the sorrows of Thy most sweet Mother and raised him to the glory of holiness and miracles, grant us through his intercession and example, so to share in the mourning of Thy Mother, that we may be saved by her maternal protection. Amen.
