

<div>WELCOME NEWCOMERS!</div> <div>If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tieJeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.<div>We are always happy to see new faces at Mary Immaculate Queen Church and we look forward to seeing you again.</div></div>	
<div>Marylike Standards of Modesty in Dress</div> <div><div><div>1. Marylike is modest without compromise, “like Mary,” Christ’s Mother.</div><div>2. Marylike dresses have sleeves extending at least to the elbows, and skirts reaching below the knees.</div><div>3. Marylike dresses require full coverage for the bodice, chest, shoulders and back; except for a cut-out about the neck not exceeding two inches below the neckline in front and in the back, and a corresponding two inches on the shoulders.</div><div>4. Marylike dresses do not admit as modest coverage transparent fabrics—laces, nets, organdy, nylons, etc.,—unless sufficient backing is added. However, their moderate use as trimmings is acceptable.</div><div>5. Marylike dresses avoid the improper use of flesh-colored fabrics.</div><div>6. Marylike dresses conceal rather than reveal the figure of the wearer; they do not emphasize, unduly, parts of the body.</div><div>7. She died a martyr to preserve and seal with her blood, her love of Jesus and her loyalty to God’s commandment.</div><div>St. Maria Goretti was beatified by Pope Pius XII on April 27, 1947. Among the vast crowd that thronged St. Peter’s Basilica ... the Holy Father congratulated the mother for the “incomparable happiness of having seen her daughter elevated to the honors of the altar.” Maria, he added, is the mature fruit of a Christian home with its old, simple method of education, “of a home where one prays, where the children are brought up in the fear of God, in obedience to their parents, in the love of truth and self-respect; accustomed to be satisfied with little and to give a helping hand.” Comparing Maria with St. Agnes, the Pope remarked that “the delicate grace of these adolescent girls might make us overlook their courage; yet strength is the virtue of virgins and martyrs...</div><div>“Our Beata was a strong soul. She knew and understood; and that is precisely why she preferred to die. She was not merely an innocent ‘ingenue,’ instinctively frightened by the shadow of sin. She was not sustained solely by a natural feeling of modesty.
