

**WELCOME NEWCOMERS!**

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

O glorious Patriarch, Saint Ignatius, we humbly beseech thee to obtain for us from Almighty God, above all things else, deliverance from sin, which is the greatest of evils, and next, from those scourges wherewith the Lord chastises the sins of His people. May thine example enkindle in our hearts an effectual desire to employ ourselves continually in laboring for the greater glory of God and the good of our fellow-men; obtain for us, likewise, from the loving Heart of Jesus our Lord, that grace which is the crown of all graces, that is to say, the grace of final perseverance and everlasting happiness. **SAINT IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA, Confessor**

**July 31—Patron of Retreats**

St. Ignatius was born of a noble family in 1491, in the Castle of Loyola in Guipuscoa, Spain. Reared in the Court of Ferdinand V of Aragon, the husband of Isabella of Castile, he entered the army and distinguished himself by his valor. He was wounded at the siege of Pamplona, in a war between Charles V and Francis I, King of France. During his convalescence he read the “Lives of the Saints” which effected his conversion from worldliness to piety. Henceforth his life belonged entirely to God.

After a general confession in the monastery of Monserrat, he spent ten months in the solitude of Manresa, where he composed his “Spiritual Exercises,” and then made a pilgrimage to Rome and the Holy Land. On his return to Spain, he began his studies, and in 1528 he went to Paris to continue them. Here his virtue and wisdom gained him a few companions, and these became the nucleus of the Society of Jesus. At Montmartre they vowed to go to Palestine, or to offer themselves to the Pope, to be employed in the service of God in some other manner. Receiving ordination at Venice together with his companions, St. Ignatius went to Rome where he was graciously received by Pope Paul III.

In 1540 Pope Paul III approved the Society and it soon made rapid progress, spreading to India in the East and to Brazil in the West. St. Ignatius continued to reside in Rome, employed in consolidating and governing his Society. There he became the friend of St. Philip Neri. He was general of the Society more than fifteen years. He died in 1556.

**SCHOOL REGISTRATION:** We ask parents to return the registration forms for your children for the new school year. **FEAST OF ST. PHILOMENA:** Devotions in her honor will be prayed after each Mass on Sunday, August 11. There will also be the blessing of St. Philomena cords.

**SUNDAY DRESS:** Remember the importance of dressing well for Mass, especially on Sundays. Men should wear a dress shirt and tie (suitcoat may be dispensed in summer, due to the heat). Women should wear a dress or skirt that covers the knees fully, whether standing or sitting, with a blouse that is not form-fitting, providing full coverage in front and back, reaching at least to the elbows on the arms.

How we dress in church indicates our reverence for God in His house.

**PARISH LIBRARY:** Daily spiritual reading is a valuable component of a good spiritual life. We have a wide selection of good books in our parish library and encourage you to take advantage of this resource.

**CHURCH DECORUM:** Please be sure to:

- 1) Turn cell phones off while in church!
- 2) Avoid leaving the church during Sunday Mass, outside of grave necessity (getting water is not a necessity)
- 3) If there is an urgent need to leave the church during Mass, do not use the front right exit.
- 4) Wait until the priest leaves the sanctuary after Mass before exiting the church.
