If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also
 wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut
 clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER, CONFESSOR <u>Raccolta</u> #500 – (*The Novena of Grace*)

O Saint Francis Xavier, well beloved and full of charity, in union with thee, I reverently adore the Majesty of God; and since I rejoice with exceeding joy in the singular gifts of grace bestowed upon thee during thy life, and thy gifts of glory after death, I give Him hearty thanks for them; I beseech thee with all my heart's devotion to be pleased to obtain for me, by thy effectual intercession, above all things, the grace of a holy life and a happy death. Moreover, I beg of thee to obtain for me ... (here mention the spiritual or temporal favor to be prayed for). But if what I ask of thee so earnestly doth not tend to the glory of God and the greater good of my soul, do thou, I pray, obtain for me what is more profitable to both these ends. Amen.

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be.

On any of nine successive days that the faithful may select for obtaining some grace through the intercession of St. Francis Xavier, if they make use of the foregoing form of prayer, or on any day that they attend the exercises of the novena, of Grace, as above, held in some church or public oratory, they are granted:

An indulgence of 3 years; A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions at the end of the exercises.

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER, Confessor December 3—Patron of Foreign Missions

The Apostle of the Indies was born at the castle of Xavier in Navarre, Spain, in 1506. He was of noble descent. At the age of eighteen he went to Paris to study philosophy. About four years later, St. Ignatius Loyola came to the same city and took up his abo de in the College of St. Barbara, to which St. Francis belonged. At that time St. Francis was full of the world and ambition, but the company of St. Ignatius exercised such a beneficent influence upon him, that he grew to be a changed man and became one of the first disciples of the saint.

In 1536 he went to Venice with the first companions of St. Ignatius. After visiting Rome, he was ordained priest at Venice in 1537, and the first Jesuits made their vows before the Pope's nuncio...In 1541 he set sail for India, which was to be the field of his labors for the rest of his life and landed at Goa the following year. From that city, which he completely reformed, his apostolic labors extended to the coast of Malabar, to Travancor, Malacca, the Moluccas and Ceylon, and in all these places he converted numbers to Christianity. In 1549 he carried the light of Faith to Japan, of which he became the first missionary, and where a flourishing Christian community soon arose. He remained in Japan two years and four months and returned to India in 1551.

He then turned his eyes to China. After visiting Goa, he set sail, in 1552 to carry out his resolve, but God was satisfied with his will. On the 23rd day after his departure from Malacca he arrived at Sancian. On November 20th a fever seized him and, alone upon a foreign shore, he died on Friday December 2, 1552 at the age of forty-six. Lives of the Saints, Pages 473-477
