

WELCOME NEWCOMERS!

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

We are always happy to see new faces at Mary Immaculate Queen Church, and we look forward to seeing you again.

SAINT ROSE OF LIMA  
August 30 – Patroness of South America

This lovely flower of sanctity, the first canonized Saint of the New World, was born at Lima, Peru in 1586. St. Rose was called Isabella at baptism; but on account of her red cheeks, her mother called her Rose.

As a child, while still in the cradle, her silence under a painful surgical operation proved the thirst for suffering already consuming her heart. At an early age she took service to support her impoverished parents and worked for them day and night. In spite of hardships and austerities her beauty ripened with increasing age...From fear of vanity she cut off her hair, blistered her face with pepper and her hands with lime. For further security she enrolled herself in the Third Order of St. Dominic, took St. Catherine of Siena as her model, and redoubled her penance.

The Blessed Sacrament seemed almost her only food. Her love for it was intense. When the Dutch fleet prepared to attack the town, Rose took her place before the tabernacle and wept that she was not worthy to die in its defense. All her sufferings were offered for the conversion of sinners, and the thought of the multitudes in hell was ever before her soul. She died in 1617, at the age of thirty-one.

St. Joseph Calasanz, Confessor  
August 27

This saint was born in Peralta de la Sal in Aragon, Spain, in 1556. He followed the course of philosophy and law at the University of Lerida and studied theology at Valencia and at Alcalá de Henares. In the latter place he received his doctorate. He became a priest in 1582. Such was his reputation for virtue that the Bishop of Lerida chose him as his confessor and appointed him his theologian and synodal examiner.

In 1592 he went to Rome and became theologian to Cardinal Marc-Antonio Colonna. Here he joined the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine. He became so convinced of the necessity of imparting religious instruction to children at an early age that he began this work alone in the Trastevere, where he rented several rooms in which he opened a little school, teaching children reading, writing and arithmetic. After some time several companions joined him in the good work, and he began to lead a community life with them. Thus, he laid the foundations of a congregation which in course of time grew to be that of the “Clerics Regular of the Poor Schools of the Mother of God.”

During the life of the holy founder his Order spread throughout Italy and afterward to other countries. By a brief of 1622 Pope Gregory XV approved the constitutions and appointed the holy founder General of the Order. The virtuous and austere life of this great servant of God came to an end on August 25, 1648.
