

WELCOME NEWCOMERS!

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

We are always happy to see new faces at Mary Immaculate Queen Church, and we look forward to seeing you again.

AN INVOCATION – RACCOLTA #113

The faithful who devoutly invoke the holy Name of Jesus may gain:

An indulgence of 300 days;

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, when they repeat this invocation daily for a month.

A plenary indulgence at the hour of death, if they have been accustomed to invoke the holy Name frequently during life, provided that, after confession and Communion, or at least an act of contrition, they devoutly invoke the holy Name of Jesus with their lips if possible, otherwise in their hearts, and accept death with resignation from the hand of God as the wages of sin.

EPIPHANY

The Feast of the Epiphany, celebrated on January 6th, is one of the oldest in the Church and one of the greatest in the ecclesiastical year. The word *Epiphany* is a Greek word which signifies a manifestation or revelation. During the first three centuries the manifestation of Christ to the chosen people and His manifestation as the Savior of all races and nations, were celebrated on the same day, but since the 4th century, December 25th has been the Feast of the Nativity, or Christmas, and January 6th the Feast of the Epiphany, or the Feast of the Three Kings. It is so-called because the gospel of the day tells us that Wise Men, or Magi, came from the East to Jerusalem saying: “Where is He that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and we have come to adore Him.”

They may have come from Arabia, Chaldea or Persia. Tradition says that there were three, Gaspar, Melchior and Balthazar. The prophecy that “a star shall rise out of Jacob,” and the teaching of the prophet Daniel at Babylon had spread throughout the East. When the mysterious star appeared, learned men recognized it as a sign that the coming of the Messiah was at hand and that He would be born in Judea. Following the star they reached Bethlehem. “And going into the house they found the child with Mary, His Mother, and falling down they adored Him; and opening their treasures, they offered to Him gifts, gold, frankincense and myrrh.”

PRAYER: O God, who on this day revealed Thy only begotten Son to the Gentiles under the guidance of a star, mercifully grant that we who know Thee now by faith, may be led on even to look upon the beauty of Thy majesty. Amen. Lives of the Saints, pgs. 23-24
