If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

We are always happy to see new faces at Mary Immaculate Queen Church, and we look forward to seeing you again.

SAINT PETER DAMIAN

Examples of generous Charity towards the departed are by no means rare...We may *include* the beautiful and touching example of St. Peter Damian, Bishop, Cardinal and Doctor of the Church. Whilst still young, Peter had the misfortune to lose his mother, and soon afterward his father marrying again, he was left to the care of a stepmother. Although he showed all possible affection for her, this woman was incapable of returning the love...she treated him with barbarous severity, and, in order to rid herself of him, sent him away to her eldest brother, who employed him to take care of the swine...The child lifted up his eyes to Heaven, where he saw another Father, in whom he placed all his confidence. He accepted all that happened as coming from His divine hands and resigned himself to the hardships of his situation.

Barely covered with rags, his biographer tells us that he had not always sufficient to appease his hunger, but he prayed to God and was satisfied. Meanwhile his father died. The young saint forgot the harshness with which he had been treated, and like a good son, prayed continually for the repose of his father’s soul. One day he found upon the road a gold piece, which Providence seemed to have placed there for him. It was quite a fortune for the poor child. But instead of making use of it to relieve his own misery, his first thought was to carry it to a priest and beg him to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the soul of his deceased father. Holy Church considers this trait of filial devotion so touching that she has inserted it at length in the Office of the feast. From the book Purgatory

BLESSED ASHES will be distributed after each Mass today for those who were unable to receive them on Ash Wednesday.

EMBER DAYS: This week is the Ember week of the spring season. That means that, in addition to the fast, there is a partial abstinence on Wednesday and Saturday. Those not bound to the Lenten fast are obligated to observe the partial abstinence on those days, which means that meat may only be taken at the main meal. For those bound to the Lenten fast, there is no additional obligation.
