

**WELCOME NEWCOMERS!**

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

**Nativity of St. John the Baptist**

The feast of the Nativity, or birthday of St. John the Baptist...is one of the oldest feasts in the liturgy of the Church...While the feast of other saints is celebrated on the day of their death...the birthday of St. John the Baptist is his feast day, as he was born free from original sin. We also have the feast of the Nativity of Mary.

Thirty years after the birth of Jesus, John began his mission on the banks of the Jordan. He was the last of the prophets of the Old Covenant. His work was to prepare the way and announce the coming of the log-expected Messias, the Redeemer, in whom all flesh would see “the salvation of God.”

Before St. John was born, an angel announced that “many would rejoice in his birth,” and so June 24<sup>th</sup> is ranked among the joyous feasts of the year. In former times, and in other lands, it was observed with greater holiday rejoicing and greater outward display than in our age. On the eve of St. John’s day “St. John’s fires” were lighted on the hills and mountains in many countries, as they are still lighted in some places. “Scarce had the last rays of the setting sun died away, when all the world over, immense columns of flames arose from every mountain top, and in an instant every town and village and hamlet was lighted up.

**#227** Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make our heart like unto Thy Heart.

*An indulgence of 500 days. A plenary indulgence once a month on the usual conditions for the devout recitation of this invocation every day.*

**#228** Sacred Heart of Jesus, Thy kingdom come!

*An indulgence of 300 days.*

**#229** Divine Heart of Jesus, convert sinners, save the dying, deliver the holy souls in purgatory. *An indulgence of 300 days.*

**#230** Sacred Heart of Jesus, I believe in Thy love for me.

*An indulgence of 300 days.*

**#231** Glory, love and thanksgiving be to the Sacred Heart of Jesus! *An indulgence of 300 days.*

**#232** Heart of love, I put all my trust in Thee; for I fear all things from my own weakness, but I hope for all things from Thy goodness.

*An indulgence of 300 days. A plenary indulgence once a month on the usual conditions, if this invocation is repeated daily with devotion.*

**#233** Sweet Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us and on our erring brethren. *An indulgence of 300 days.*
