

WELCOME NEWCOMERS!

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
 - Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
 - Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
 - Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.
- We are always happy to see new faces at Mary Immaculate Queen Church, and we look forward to seeing you again.

SAINT MARIA GORETTI – July 9
Patroness of Youth

St. Maria Goretti is one of the youngest saints of the Roman Catholic Church. She died a martyr to preserve, and seal with her blood, her love of Jesus and her loyalty to God’s commandment.

St. Maria Goretti was beatified by Pope Pius XII on April 27, 1947. Among the crowd that thronged St. Peter’s Basilica on that memorable day were Maria’s mother, brother and two sisters. In his address to the pilgrims, who had come for the ceremony, largely Catholic Action groups of girls, the Holy Father congratulated the mother for the “incomparable happiness of having seen her daughter elevated to the honors of the altar.” Maria, he added, is the mature fruit of a Christian home with its old simple method of education, “of a home where one prays, where the children are brought up on the fear of God, in obedience to their parents, in the love of truth and self-respect; accustomed to be satisfied with little and to give a helping hand.” Comparing Maria with St. Agnes, the Pope remarked that “the delicate grace of these adolescent girls might make us overlook their courage; yet strength is the virtue of virgins and martyrs.”

PRAYER FOR AMERICA

We pray Thee, O almighty and eternal God, who through Jesus Christ hast revealed Thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of Thy mercy; that Thy Church, being spread through the whole world, may continue, with unchanging faith, in the confession of Thy name.

We pray Thee, O God of might, wisdom, and justice, through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist, with Thy Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude, the President of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness, and be eminently useful to Thy people over whom he presides, by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality. Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of the Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government; so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge, and may perpetuate to us the blessings of equal liberty.

We pray for his Excellency the Governor of this State, for the members of the Assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare; that they may be enabled, by Thy powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.

We recommend likewise to Thy unbounded mercy all States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge, and sanctified in the observance of Thy most holy law; that they may be preserved in union and in that peace which the world cannot give; and, after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.
