

WELCOME NEWCOMERS!

If this is the first time you have attended the Traditional Latin Mass, you may have noticed that our parishioners do not dress casually in the church. Since the changes in the Church, few parishes have any kind of dress code. Here, however, we still believe that modesty and appropriate attire are necessary, especially in Church out of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament. Please observe these minimum standards of dress for attendance at Church services:

- Women and girls must cover their heads. Chapel veils or mantillas are available for loan in the vestibule. They should also wear dresses or skirts that cover the knee completely when standing or sitting; slacks, shorts, sleeveless, tight, or low-cut clothing are not permitted.
- Men and boys should wear a suit coat and tie.
- Jeans and other casual attire are inappropriate for attendance at Church services.
- Also, unless you have been attending the Latin Mass exclusively, you should refrain from receiving Holy Communion until you have had an opportunity to meet with Father.

SAINT CLARE, Virgin

August 12 – *Patroness against Sore Eyes*

Assisi, the birthplace of St. Francis, had also the honor of giving birth to St. Clare, his spiritual daughter. From her childhood she desired to consecrate herself to Jesus Christ. Having heard of St. Francis and his sanctity, she found means to be conducted to him by a pious matron...For the present St. Francis placed her in a Benedictine convent of nuns...Later her sister Agnes joined her. St. Francis now placed them in a separate house. Soon after, her mother and several other ladies, some of high nobility, united themselves to her. The foundation of Poor Clares, or the Second Order of St. Francis was thus laid. Within a few years St. Clare founded a number of other monasteries and her Order spread to Germany and Bohemia.

The austerities these religious women practiced had scarcely ever been known among their sex. Together with other mortifications, their fast was perpetual. Such was the spirit of poverty of St. Clare that when, after her profession, she fell heiress to the large fortune of her father, she gave all of it to the poor. St. Clare's life came to an end, August 12, 1253.

St. Philomena, Virgin Martyr – August 11
Patroness and Protectress of the Living
Rosary

In 1802, the bones of a female between the ages of 13 and 15 were discovered in the catacomb of St. Priscilla. An inscription near her tomb read "Peace be with thee, Philomena, along with drawings of 2 anchors, 3 arrows and a palm. Near her bones was discovered a small glass vial, containing the remains of blood. Because it was a popular custom of the early martyrs to leave symbols and signs such as these, it was easily determined that St. Philomena was a virgin and a martyr. In 1805 a representative of the "Treasury of Relics" in the Vatican reached the relics of St. Philomena and was suddenly struck with a spiritual joy and requested that he be allowed to enshrine them in a chapel in Mugnano. Miracles began to be reported at the shrine including cures of cancer, healing of wounds, and Venerable Pauline Jaricot was cured of a severe heart ailment overnight. Philomena became the only person recognized as a Saint solely on the basis of miraculous intercession as nothing historical was known of her except her name and the evidence of her martyrdom.

Pope Leo XII granted permission for the erection of altars and churches in her honor. Pope Gregory XVI authorized her public veneration and named her patroness of the Living Rosary. The cure of Pope Pius IX, while archbishop of Imola, was attributed to Philomena; in 1849, he named her patroness of the Children of Mary. Pope Leo XIII approved the Confraternity of Saint Philomena, and raised it to Archconfraternity, and named St. John Vianney its patron. St. John Vianney himself called St. Philomena the New Light of the Church Militant and had a strong and well-known devotion to her. *New Advent.org*
